### WHITE WINES

**DOMAINE JEAN-MARIE NAULIN, CHABLIS 2007. FRANCE.**

**£19.50**

WITH RIPE HONEYED FRUIT FLAVOURS BALANCED BY GOOD ACIDITY, THIS IS A TRUE UN-OAKED CHABLIS. CHALKY LIMESTONE SOIL ASSURES THE PURITY OF THE GRAPE TO GIVE THIS WINE A GOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT AND WITH A ZINGY LIME FINISH, IT IS IDEAL WITH ALL POULTRY AND WHITE FISH DISHES.

**FLYING KIWI, MARLBOROUGH SAUVIGNON BLANC 2008. NEW ZEALAND.**

THIS CLASSIC SAUVIGNON IS PALE STRAW IN COLOUR WITH SLIGHT GREEN LIGHTS. PASSIONFRUIT AND GOOSEBERRY MEET WITH A CRISP ACIDITY AND SOME HERBAL NOTES TO ADD COMPLEXITY TO A VERY DRINKABLE WINE. A REAL WINNER WITH SALADS AND LIGHTER SEAFOOD, BUT JUST AS PLEASURABLE WITHOUT FOOD.

### RED WINES

**URBINA, RIOJA CRIANZA 2004. SPAIN.**

FROM THE HEART OF RIOJA COUNTRY IN NORTHERN SPAIN, THIS CRIANZA IS A BLEND OF TEMPRANILLO AND GARNACHA GRAPES. WITH A VERY SVELT PALATE AND DELICIOUS RIPE DAMSON FRUIT FLAVOURS. UNLIKE SOME OAK AGED RIOJAS, THE TRADITIONAL BARREL FERMENTATION DOES NOT DETRACT FROM THE ORIGINAL FLAVOURS.

**DE BORTOLI, PINOT NOIR 2008. AUSTRALIA.**

CHEERY RED IN COLOUR WITH LIGHT PURPLE TINGES, THIS PINOT NOIR IS A LIGHT EASY DRINKING RED. THE CHEERY COLOUR CARRIES THROUGH INTO A BEAUTIFUL MIXTURE OF TASTES WITH STRAWBERRIES AND OTHER SUMMER FRUITS, AND WITH SILKY TANNINS AND A MILD HERBACEOUS END IT IS CLEAR TO SEE WHY THIS WINEMAKER HAS BEEN AT THE TOP OF THE TREE FOR SO LONG.

### ROSE WINES

**WELMOED, ROSE 2007. SOUTH AFRICA.**

FROM THE POPULAR STELLENBOSCH REGION IN SOUTH AFRICA. THIS BLEND OF PINOTAGE AND SHIRAZ GIVES AN INTENSE DEEP PINK COLOUR, SLIGHTLY SWEETER THAN A TYPICAL ROSE. ALTOGETHER A VERY EASY DRINKING WINE FOR ANY OCCASION.
